1. DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

Cllr B Jull declared a Non-Pecuniary interest in item 5 on the agenda

2. APOLOGIES

Cllr Kim Sissons was not at the meeting.

3. MINUTES TO THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS

The minutes were approved and signed as a true record.

4. MATTERS ARISING

Clerk advised that dumped settee in Vicar Lane had been removed as requested and that pot holes and flattened road sign had not been rectified despite being reported to ERYC.

5. YORKSHIRE WATER PROPOSALS

John Bond attended meeting and was welcomed by Chair. He stated he had 5 topics to report on namely:-

- a) **OUTFALL.** There has been a loss of rock bags due to stormy weather so additional funding has been sourced to provide another 35-40 rocks bags of 4 and 8 tons with triple mesh commencing 18.4.18 with continued monitoring.
- b) **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT (EIA)** The Marine Management Organisation (MMO) has requested a full EIA on the Long Sea Outfall (LSO) potentially delaying the planning application until next year. Cllr Boasman asked if the rocks armouring of the existing LSO might have to last another year to which John Bond confirmed.
- c) **ODOUR MODELLING.** This had been compiled with Bridlington data. Local data (exact source to be confirmed by John Bond) has now been used showing improved results. Mapping provided.
- d) **LIDAR.** Drone data produced for Dec. to March 18 showing extent of coastal erosion. This data is produced monthly and in stormy conditions.
- e) **VISIT TO WISBECH.** Chair attended a visit to Anglian Water Treatment Works on 26 March which has been operating for 10 years and expected to operate for a further 20 years. This plant was operational to assess noise/odour levels and John Bond stated that no complaints had been received regarding this plant. It operates with the same technology as the proposed new plant and the lagoons had not required emptying , potentially not requiring emptying for the next 20 years. Chair prepared a quote for publication regarding the results of his visit.

Finally, John Bond stated that a planning application was hopeful for next month.

Chair thanked John Bond for attending the meeting.
