1. DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

Cllrs B Jull, A Ives & L Healing declared Non-Pecuniary interests in item 6 on the agenda

2. APOLOGIES

Cllr Lindgren was unable to attend the meeting.

3. MINUTES TO THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS

The minutes (which had previously been circulated) were approved and signed as a true record.

4. MATTERS ARISING

Cllr Jull stated that LIDAR information still hadn't been received. Cllr Healing to take forward. Also nothing further had been received from Cllr Tucker regarding the Dog Litter Bins. Posters for the dog litter campaign were to be photocopied to seal the ink for weather reasons.

5. CO-OPTION OF NEW CLLR

Jonnie Purse was Co-opted onto Hollym Parish Council.

6. PLANNING

Application ino Mr & Mrs Harman ref 18/01928/PLF for land east of Orchard Garth, North Leys Rd for a detached dwelling with garage (amended plans)was unanimously refused by Cllrs on the grounds of size, sewage,tree loss, not in keeping and outline permission was for a bungalow whereas this was for a house.

Application in the name of Yorkshire Water for a Sewage Plant at land south of Happy Landings with improved access off A1033 ref 18/02089/STPLFwas debated by Cllrs and voted on unanimously to refuse this application with numerous concerns as follows:-

Myers Lane is used by dog walkers and horse riders and as such it could not be secured and risked further unauthorised and potentially illegal use. An upgrade to two way traffic would necessitate the hedge being removed. Access to Myers Lane was on a bend. Concerns were voiced regarding the loss of wildlife habitat – wild birds were on site. The plan applied for 2 open lagoons – covering 9 acres which could cause odour – on a 21 acre site. Concerns were voiced regarding the further upgrade of this site in view of the surplus land making it even bigger. Questions were raised about the weather information being accurate for Hollym and regarding wind direction and odour towards the village. No indication was given on the plans for solving any issues raised with odour problems. Microplastic filters were a problem. Villagers opinion was against this proposal as it has no benefit for the village, only drawbacks whilst constructing the site and laying pipelines. No Community Fund has been mentioned.
